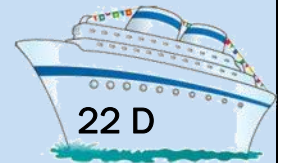

## Leader Dog Kennel UpDate for September

As mentioned last month, the interior of the building is looking more complete. The epoxy floors are getting buffed and the inlaid paw prints throughout the building are really starting to pop. The suites in both the male and female sections of the breeding area are up along with counters, bathing stations and specialized waste disposal units (which resemble toilets). The gates connecting the indoor puppy pens have been installed and the separation of day to night areas are more apparent.

The outside of the building is almost complete. The only remaining elements are fencing around the outdoor puppy pens and a small brick patio area. The basement of the kennel is buzzing as the team members who were temporarily relocated there have begun planning the move into the new space.

A total of \$13.4 million dollars has been raised toward the total campaign goal of \$14.5 million! We continue to engage Lions Clubs, foundations, corporations and individuals nationwide along with Leader Dog friends and family to raise the final amount needed to reach goal.

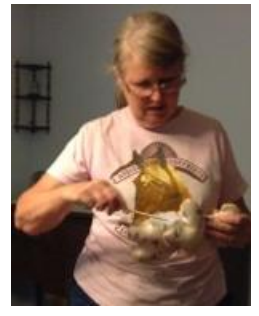
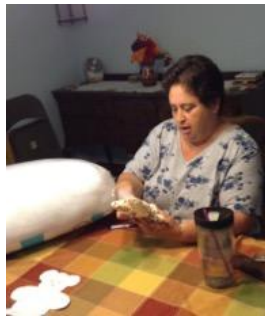
## Club Happenings

### Frederica Spring Creek Lions

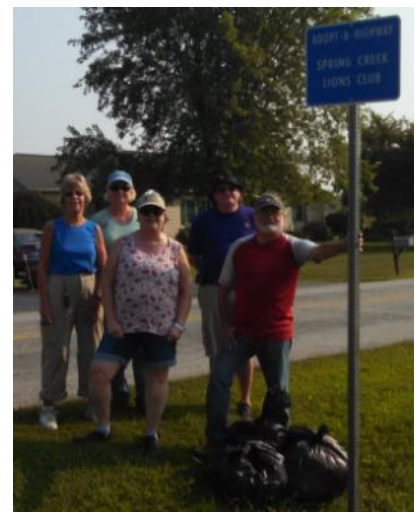
We held a White Cane Day at Royal Farms in Felton and collected \$400. Thank you to all who worked the event and to those who donated.

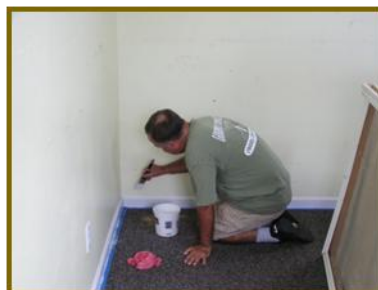
Received a "Thank You" from Eagles Fest and cleared \$1180.10 on Funnel Cakes and Lemonade.

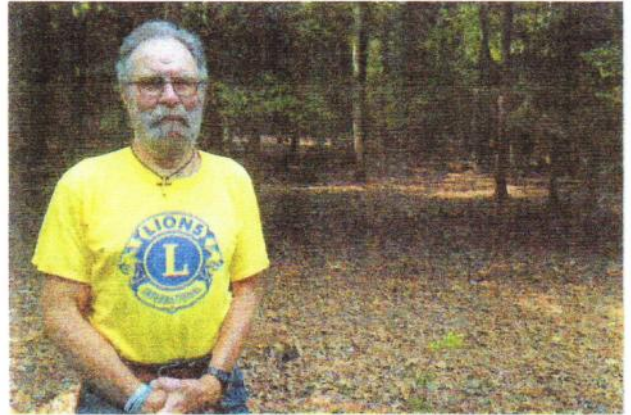

### Fenwick Lions donate beach wheelchair to state park

At the July board meeting of the Fenwick Island Lions Club, the board voted unanimously to purchase and donate a second beach wheelchair to Fenwick Island State Park. The chairs allow individuals with mobility issues to easily cross the soft sand, which could otherwise be a barrier for enjoying the pleasures of a day at the beach.

Several years ago, at the request of the state park, the Fenwick Island Lions Club provided a beach wheelchair for their patrons use. In early July, Rosetta

Grimm, a representative of the park, had attended a luncheon meeting of the club and requested it consider providing another chair to help meet the current demand.

Grimm pointed out that the park has become so popular that often there is often a waiting line of cars along Route 1 to enter the area, and that increasingly the park is being visited by families who have older members, and others with mobility issues, who cannot cross wide stretches of the soft sand beach.

Two members of the club, Sam Mooney and his wife, Muriel, recently witnessed just that when they visited the state park beach with their family. While there, they encountered a gentleman, Monroe Robbins, using the chair that the club had previously provided. He shared with Sam Mooney that visiting the beach with his family had been on his "bucket list" and the chair made it all possible. And Mooney said he came away feeling that "this is an omen of the importance of what we do as Lions."

The chairs are lightweight — being made primarily of PVC piping — and they have large soft tires that are inflated to just 4 pounds of pressure, so that they nearly glide across the sand with a minimum of effort.

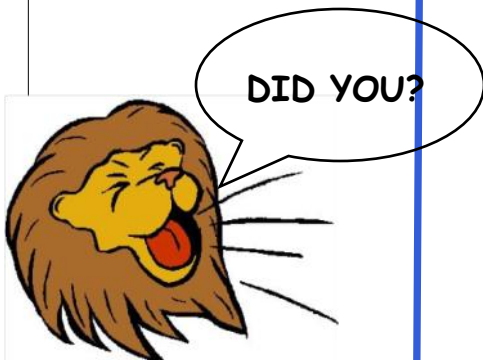
