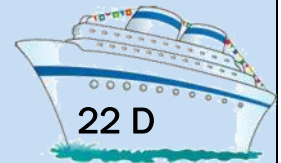

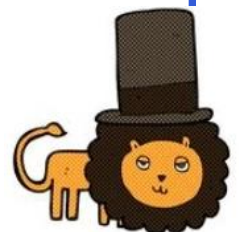

Lions Vision Research Foundation

LVRF Dinner —February 29, 2016 @ Modern Maturity See invitation on page 16.

The Lions of MD22 through a partnership with the Wilmer Eye Institute at Johns Hopkins Hospital are supporting low vision research and rehabilitation to minimize the disabilities caused by low vision and blindness through their Lions Vision Research Foundation, Inc. (LVRF).

We have established a \$4 million Endowment Fund. Earnings from this Endowment support the operation of the Foundation.

Through additional donations from Clubs and Individuals, we are funding a \$100,000 Fellowship established to provide an opportunity for a doctor with advanced training to spend a year working at Wilmer doing research, receiving additional education and assisting with patient care in the clinic.

We have received two grants from LCIF to help fund our major projects: Lions Low Vision Education and LOVRNET.

6 Lions from District 22-D traveled to Tola, Nicaragua, where they worked hand in hand with the Rivas Cacique and Rivas De Cento Lions



Clubs for two weeks. The Lions served in many capacities and all came away with a greater feeling of international Lionism. Over

2300 people were seen and evaluated for eye glasses and over 2000 pairs of prescription and sunglasses were dispensed. 70 operations were performed, correcting cataracts, pyteriga and ambyopia. Children with "lazy eye" are ostracized in Nicaragua, thus corrective surgery assists them with enhanced self esteem and potential for greater employment opportunities. A young man, upon seeing his father regain his vision, broke down in tears, saying "you have given him a wonderful gift!" And that is what

this trip was about, the gift of sight. It was my pleasure to have served with these great Lions!

Lovrnet News

To date, Lions LOVRNET has created online programs for Lion Volunteer training including Hipaa Compliance. 50 Lions have completed the training and are now conducting Patient Interviews. LOVRNET has created accredited continuing education course for professionals wishing to acquire knowledge and skills needed to provide low vision rehabilitation services. Approximately 40 low vision rehabilitation professionals have completed this training.

LOVRNET has also created and assembled low vision device kits to be distributed to professionals participating in the LOVRNET project. Three Doctors are now utilizing these kits. The e-commerce system has been developed for purchasing low vision devices.

Ultimately, the goal is to provide continuing education or basic training on low vision rehabilitation to 65 ophthalmologists, optometrists and 300 Lions in MD 22.

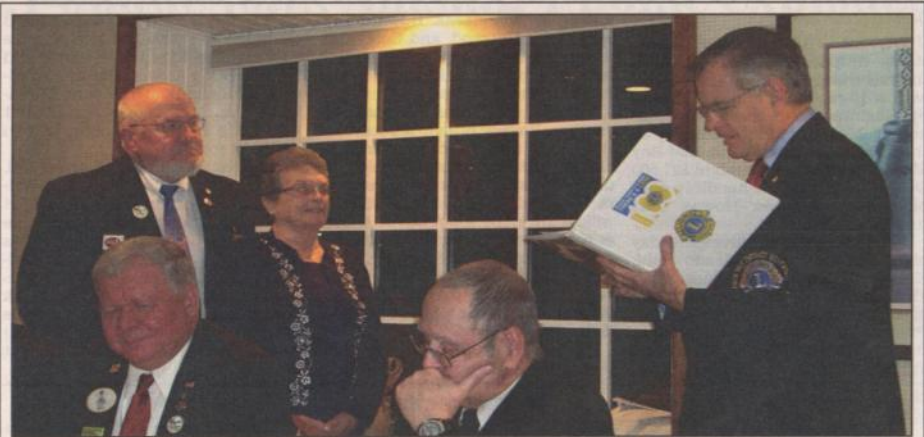

When school children in the Indian River School District need vision screenings, the Lord Baltimore Lions Club is there.

When someone needs a wheelchair-accessible ramp built at their home or needs to be fed, the Lord Baltimore Lions Club is there.

Simply put, when a person in Bethany Beach, Ocean View, Millville, Clarksville, Frankford or Dagsboro is in need, don't be surprised if the Lord Baltimore Lions Club is there.

After all, that's what the service organization has done for 70 years in coastal Delaware, as the nonprofit celebrates a milestone birthday this month. Just like when the group started, it meets on the first and third Wednesdays of the month.

that has a good history of helping the community for that long," said Janet Bauer, the second vice president of the 58-member group of men and women who constantly volunteer to help others.

While much has changed since Jan. 23, 1946, when a group of businessmen in the Ocean View area came together to start the service-based organization, the group's core mission stays the same.

"Service to others is an addiction," said Karl Gude, a 22-year member of the club and its current president. "It truly is."

When the heater broke down at SOUL Ministries' Bethany Beach homeless shelter last winter, it was the Lions Club that arranged for an HVAC technician to fix it that day and took care of the bill, according to Cherith Snyder, co-founder of SOUL Ministries and the director of the homeless shelter.

The club has worked with SOUL Ministries for about four years to regularly help the needy by providing eye screenings, clothing and food.

"They're changing the world one box of food at a time and one pair of eyes at a time," Snyder said. "It's so cool to see the heart they have for the community."

The organization wanted to celebrate its 70th anniversary because some of its older members may not be around for the more traditionally celebrated 75th anniversary, Gude said.

Four Lord Baltimore Lions have been members of the club for more than 40

years. At 48 years, Bob Jones is the third longest serving member of the club.

"You got to be active in life," said the 92-year-old. "You don't want to sit back and let the world go on by."

The club hosts several fundraisers over the course of the year, from chicken

and dumpling dinners, to fruit sales and a community yard sale. Any proceeds collected from the public must go back into the community, Gude said, adding that member dues, and not money from the public, fund operating costs.

"If I collect a dollar from you, I have to give that dollar away," he said. "That's one of the things that makes me the proudest to be a Lion, is to be part of an organization that feels that way."

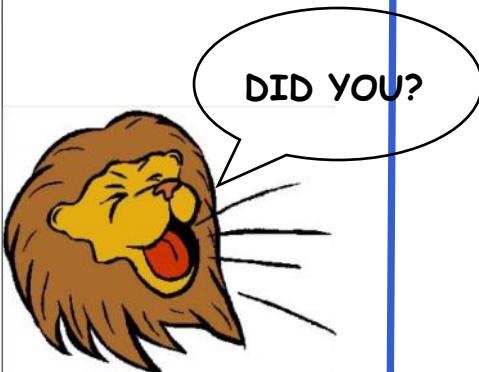
