Fourth Cabinet Meeting



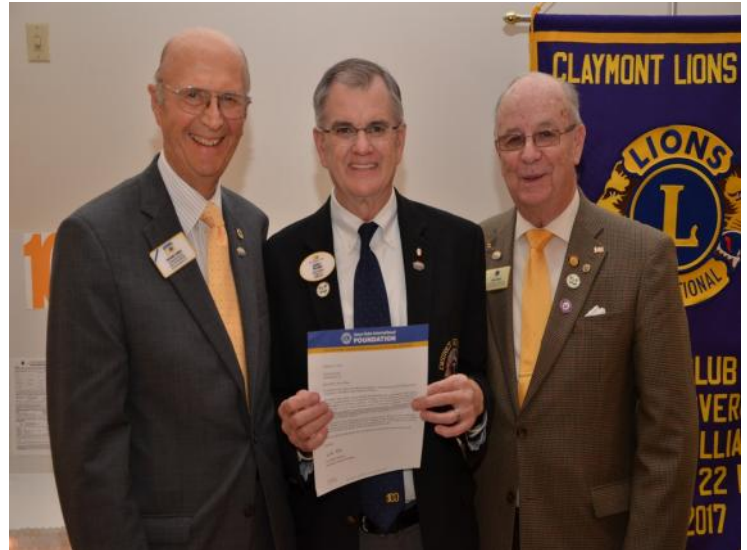
