Congratulations to Kayla Newton, a student at the Howard High School of Technology in Wilmington who received our George Bigger Memorial Vo-Tech Award for 2017.



Our scholarship recipients for this year have been selected, Kelly Moyer and Cody Outten, and the awards will be presented on May 31st.








