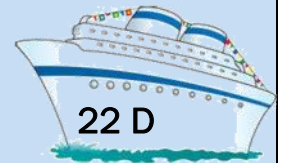

On Behalf of the Parade Committee, I would like to take this opportunity to say thanks to the many Lions, Leos and Guests that helped to make the Lions participation in the National Memorial Day Parade a tremendous success. Over the past seven years this function has been viewed by an ever increasing number of people. 2015 estimates were for over 500,000 along the viewing route, and millions more reached by multiple TV broadcasts, and printed advertising. Plus, Miss America was the celebrity on our Float, so we received extra exposure when we were stopped at the reviewing stand while she sang God Bless America.

However, all of this comes at a price, and in the past, LCI has stepped up and provided grants to help cover the cost of our participation. LCI has stated that during the next two years, this particular financial help will not be available, so if we plan to continue participating in this parade, we will have to find other methods to finance it. The cost of participation in the parade comes in at around \$19,000.00 (\$15,000.00 Entry Fee and Float.

The rest is for transportation, additional advertising, water and refreshments for Marchers, and etc.) The committee has worked to keep costs down and continues to do so. We have over half of the needed amount on hand but need to come up with the rest.

This year, the emphasis is on our upcoming Centennial, and the only PR Funding I can find is a Grant of \$1,500.00 for each District. Needless to say, that is not enough to continue our participation. If we are to continue, we need the support of not only MD22 and District 24A, but all the States of the Eastern part of the United States. If we are able to participate, our Float will be decorated with the Centennial Motif, so I think it would qualify as a Centennial PR Project that could be supported by all Districts.

The bottom line is that without funding, this tremendous PR event will die on the vine. Your monetary and physical support is needed. We also have T-Shirts and Neck coolers for sale to help offset the costs.

Today, the Lord Baltimore Lions have 60 members, men and women from all walks of life, who identify needs within the community and work together to fulfill these needs.

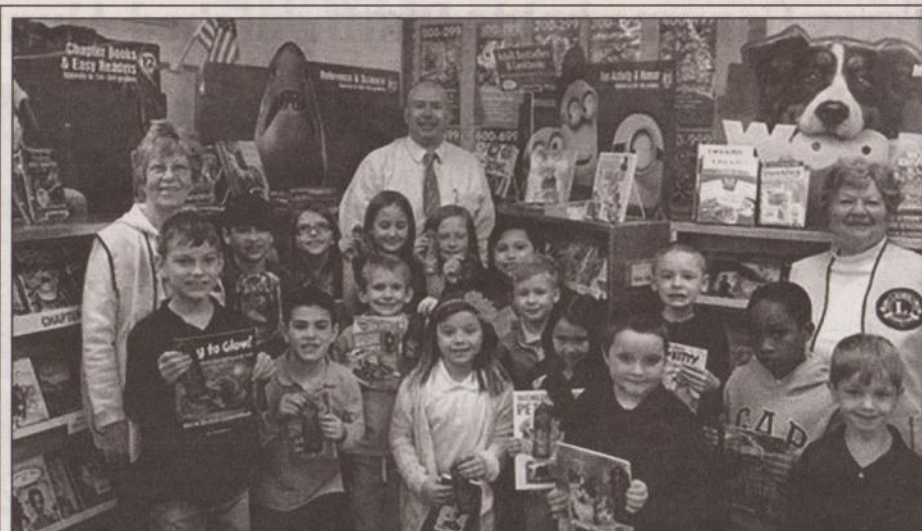
