As mentioned last month, the interior of the building is looking more complete. The epoxy floors are getting buffed and the inlaid paw prints throughout the building are really starting to pop. The suites in both the male and female sections of the breeding area are up along with counters, bathing stations and specialized waste disposal units (which resemble toilets). The gates connecting the indoor puppy pens have been installed and the separation of day to night areas are more apparent.

The outside of the building is almost complete. The only remaining elements are fencing around the outdoor puppy pens and a small brick patio area. The basement of the kennel is buzzing as the team members who were temporarily relocated there have begun planning the move into the new space.

A total of \$13.4 million dollars has been raised toward the total campaign goal of \$14.5 million! We continue to engage Lions Clubs, foundations,

corporations and individuals nationwide along with Leader Dog friends and family to raise the final amount needed to reach goal.






