

This year's LCIF goal of \$30,000 and 100% club participation was establish by District Governor Jim Coverdale and myself. We have reached the half way point of the Lion year, 2015-2016. The district stands at 15% of the \$30,000 LCIF goal or \$4,555.00 and 20% of clubs participating which is 7 of the 35 clubs. This report is as of the end of November.

LCIF continues to meet great humanitarian needs; so please consider making a contribution to LCIF, your foundation. On the giving front, there are two new ways to contribute to LCIF. One is through the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) which is our United Way effort but LCIF is now a place to designate those donations for Federal employees. Also, these CFC donations can go toward a Melvin Jones Fellowship or Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship. The second new contribution idea is for LIONS to make contributions out our own pockets, either through contributions for Melvin Jones Fellowship or Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship or Progressive or through a legacy type contribution. Many Lions have recently received a mailing about this LCIF legacy program.

Our LOVRNET project is now has three eye care practices signed up to be part of LOVRNET. 
