IPDG M. Charles Taylor is accepting donations in support of his plan to **KISS THE PIG** at the Delaware State Fair in Harrington on July 26th.

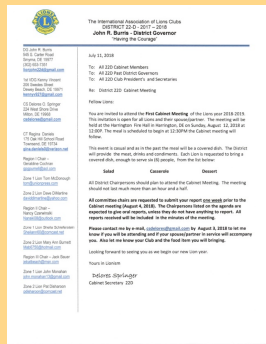

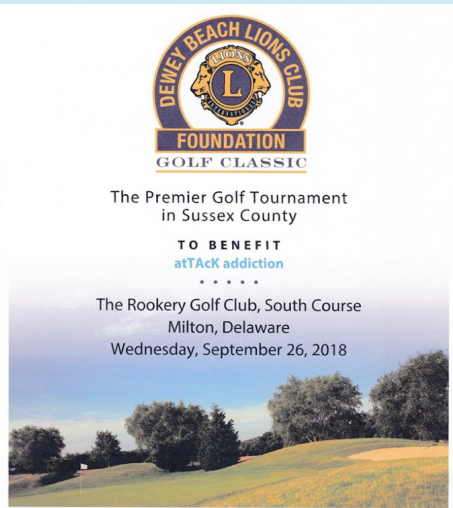
