ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS

My fellow Lions, as we do our best to help improve our environment, we might not think about how we dispose of old prescription drugs and over the counter medications. Flushing medicine down the toilet can end up polluting the water we drink. Throwing your pills in the garbage can become a toxic disposal. Instead, take part in local "Take Back" programs. Check with your local police departments as many have containers at your disposal.

As many of you might already know, the state of Delaware has removed many of the road side recycle bins.
