
Multiple District 22 Convention May 18-21, 2015

Cpl. Adam Mease, the Newark High School Re-source Officer, has been honored as by the New-ark Lions Club as its 2014 Officer of the Year. The award presented

recognizes Mease for no merous accomplish ments, both in the school and in the community, said Cpl. James Spadola, public information offi-cer for the Newark Police

Department. Mease became a certified Drug Recognition Expert after attending an intensive multi-week training program, using those skills to make five driving under the influence arrests while work-ing in an extra-duty capacity outside the high school, Spadola said.

learned in active shooter, school safety and threat training during in-ser-vice training at the school.

Mease also is credited revitalizing the

Newark Explorers program that engages oungsters interested in law enforcement careers and was part of an officers' team that spearheaded a popular new edi-tion of police trading cards, Spadola said

Mease previously was honored for his work on the trading card project, with much of his time spent on it after-hours, by the Delaware League of Local Governments.

He also initiated new crime prevention mea-sures at the school, including registering serial numbers of cell phones and other valuables to help if they are lost or stolen, and posted signs to remind students to lock cars and keep valuables out of view, Spadola said.

Earlier, Mease was named Officer of the Quarter for the first quarter of 2014 for his han-dling of two incidents at the school.

The first was Jan. 17, when police received a report of a fight in front

of the school.

Mease quickly deter-mined the incident was a robbery, developed wit-ness information and used school surveillance to get images of the suspect, distributing them and confirming the suspect's identity within an hour, Spadola said. He gave that information to detectives, who quickly obtained an arrest war

rant, he added.

The second incident
was Feb. 3, when school administrators notified Mease they found an 18-year-old student with marijuana, Spadola said. The student was found with 46 grams of marijua-na packaged for sale in 45 small plastic vials and seven small bags, he said.

As a result of Mease's investigation, they also found a loaded 45 caliber handgun and large quan-tity of cash, Spadola said, and "the student was arrested and a large quanti-ty of illegal narcotics and a loaded, stolen handgun were removed from the school."


